At the last MCAC meeting, it was suggested that we try to find out from oldtimers in the City whether there has always been furniture refinishing/repairing going on in the back parking lot of Culver Furniture, and that if there has been, the Committee might consider allowing such outside work to continue.

At the suggestion of Lt. Steve Williams, on this date the Senior Code Enforcement Officer and the prosecutor stopped by Ed Little's Auto Repair, 4318 Sepulveda Blvd., down the block from Culver Furniture. We spoke with Bob Little, Ed Little's son.

Bob told us that he has been working with his father since 1977, and since that time there has always been furniture refinishing/repair going on in the parking lot, and that the lean-to cover which shields the workers has also always been there. He said he will talk to his father to see if Ed has recollections prior to 1977.
